



***Craig Vette: Construction Volunteer, Critical Home Repair Volunteer***

Craig Vette worked for the U.S. Customs and Border Protection and found himself moving every four years. In 2006, he landed in Columbus, Ohio and eventually retired and planted roots in buckeye country. During several summers, Craig volunteered with Habitat MidOhio through his church. He enjoys working with his regular crew, and likes the fact that volunteering keeps him busy since retirement. “Habitat keeps something regular on my schedule. Outside of Habitat, Craig is active in the Lutheran Church and enjoys landscaping and gardening. Since retirement, Craig has also vested an interest in genealogy and spends time discovering his family’s lineage.

We'll teach you the skills you need and encourage you to try new things, but we're not going to force you to do anything you are not comfortable doing. You will find the service and fellowship with our neighbors to be incredibly rewarding".
